

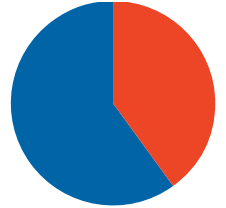
Georgia D-SNPs At a Glance

How many GA residents are enrolled in both Medicare & Medicaid?

There were about **375,00 Georgia residents enrolled in both Medicare and Medicaid (“dually eligible”) in 2023.**¹

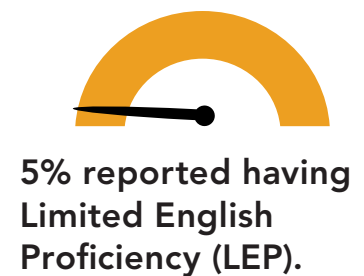
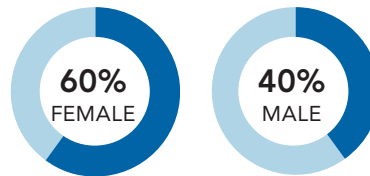
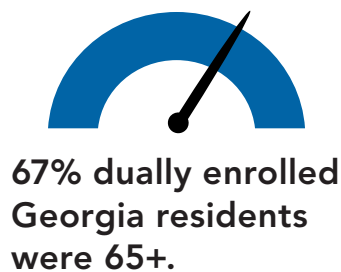
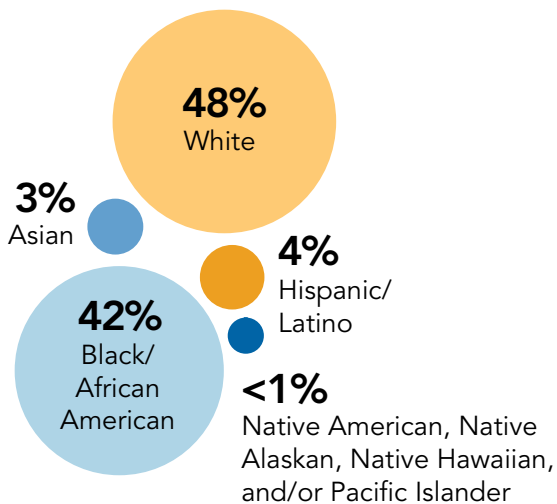
151,000 individuals, or about 40% of dually eligible individuals in Georgia, had full Medicaid benefits. These individuals are referred to as full-benefit dually eligible individuals.

225,000 individuals, or about 60% of dually eligible individuals in Georgia, did not have full Medicaid; rather, their Medicaid coverage was limited to assistance paying for Medicare costs through enrollment in a Medicare Saving Program (MSP). These individuals are referred to as partial-benefit dually eligible individuals.



What are some features of the dually enrolled population in GA?

According to American Community Survey data from 2017-2022:²



The most common languages reported by dually eligible Georgia residents with LEP were **Spanish, Vietnamese, and Korean.**

What is the D-SNP landscape for dually eligible GA residents?



About 211,000 Georgia residents, or 56% of people dually eligible for Medicare and Medicaid, are enrolled in a Dual Eligible Special Needs Plan (D-SNP).³

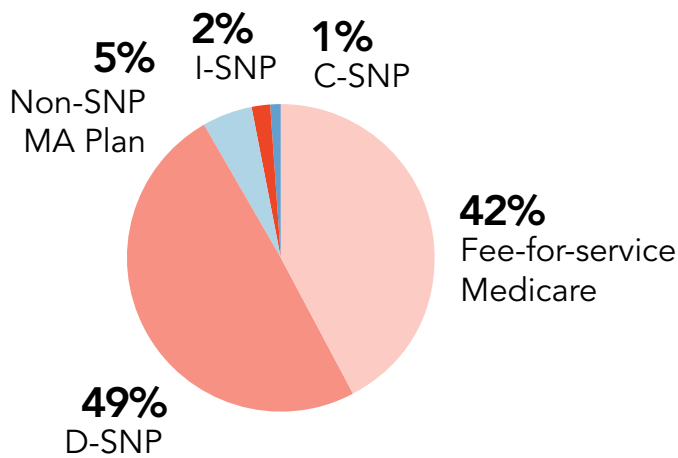
The most-enrolled D-SNP contracts were **Care Improvement Plus South Central, Humana, and SilverScript.**⁴

As of 2022, Georgia did not enroll its dually eligible population into Medicaid managed care plans.⁵

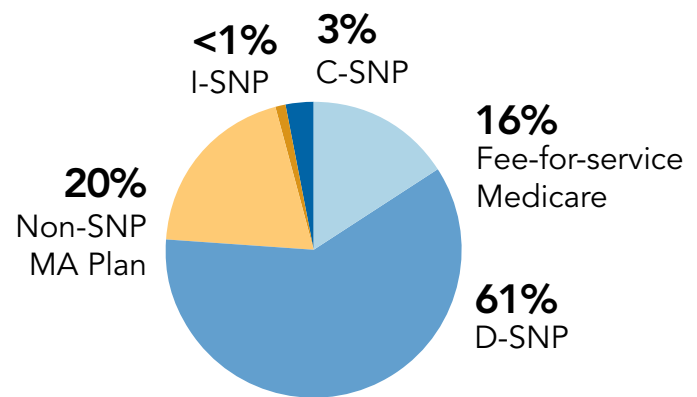
